## HEALTHY AND WHEELCHAIR ACCESSIBLE ROUTE ALONG THE CADIZ SEABOARD

Cadiz also has a tourist route for those people who love exercise and long walks. The 12-km route, which is also accessible for people with reduced mobility, the majority of which runs alongside the sea, takes you around the perimeter of the city where you will discover landscapes and spots of exceptional beauty. Our fantastic beaches and our promenades, the old bastions and walled defences, the beautiful views looking out over our bay, the bridges that link the city with the rest of the province... You can stop along the way to get your strength back in some of the city's zones that are best known for their culinary heritage.

APPROX. TOTAL: 12 Km. & WHEELCHAIR ACCESSIBILITY: 100%

Starting from the Tourist Welcome Centre, go along the Avenida del Puerto to the Plaza de España, where the majestic Monument to the Cadiz Parliament rises up in the square. Go up Calle San Germán and Calle Honduras to the Alameda Apodaca, which is a magnificent lookout point over the Bay of Cadiz, where the Baluarte de Candelaria, a former bastion that is a dramatic art and exhibition centre, and the Church of El Carmen, where the Te Deum was performed on 19 March 1812, the day that the first Spanish Constitution was proclaimed, are located.

The Route continues along the Paseo Carlos III. a promenade that is home to the Reina Sofia Cultural Centre, whose collections include the permanent exhibition of sculptures by Juan Luis Vasallo, and the Contemporary Creation Space - ECCO, which hosts the most avant-garde art exhibitions and where the Valle de los Caídos [Valley of the Fallen] Collection by Costus is one of the highlights.

Once you reach this point on the route, you can choose between continuing along the seaboard along the Paseo de Santa Bárbara or going through the Genovés Park, a botanical garden and the most important green area in the city's Old Town. Either way will bring you to Avenida Dr. Gómez Ulla and the La Caleta Beach.

There are spectacular views on your right as you continue along the Avenida Duque de Náiera, an avenue right in the heart of the La Viña district, from where you can reach the Santa Catalina and San Sebastián Castles, both of which can be visited.

As you continue along the Avenida del Campo del Sur, you will go past the magnificent Cadiz Cathedral, the Old Cathedral or the Church of Santa Cruz and the remains of the Cadiz Roman Theatre, and with the breathtaking views of the sea to your right. Continue along Calle Concepción Arenal to the Ibero-America Centre, the former Royal Jail and which now hosts important exhibitions.

The route takes you through the Puerta de Tierra [Shore Gateway] bastion and along Avenida Fernández Lareda, and then to the Promenade that runs parallel to the Santa María del Mar and Victoria beaches

The Ingeniero La Cierva Roundabout is the following point on your route. Cross to Calle Goya, right in the heart of the La Laguna District, and carry on to Avenida Juan Carlos I. When you reach the Old Tabacalera Warehouse, take Avenida Marconi and then Avenida de la Ilustración to the Bay of Cadiz Promenade, with its breathtaking views of the magnificent 1812 Constitution Bridge, a civil engineering

At the end of the promenade, you will reach the Bahía de Centro Shopping Centre. From there, go up the Avenida de Huelva and Avenida de San Severiano until you again reach Avenida Juan Carlos I. Make you way to the Avenida de Andalucía, the city's main roadway, along the Vicente Aleixandre and Dr. Jose Manuel Pascual y Pascual streets. You will go past the Parques Erytheia and Kotinoussa, an ancient burial ground where Roman and Phoenician remains have been unearthed and can still

Go through the Puerta de Tierra gateway again and continue to the Cuesta de las Calesas and back to the Tourist Welcome Centre, where this route starts and ends.
